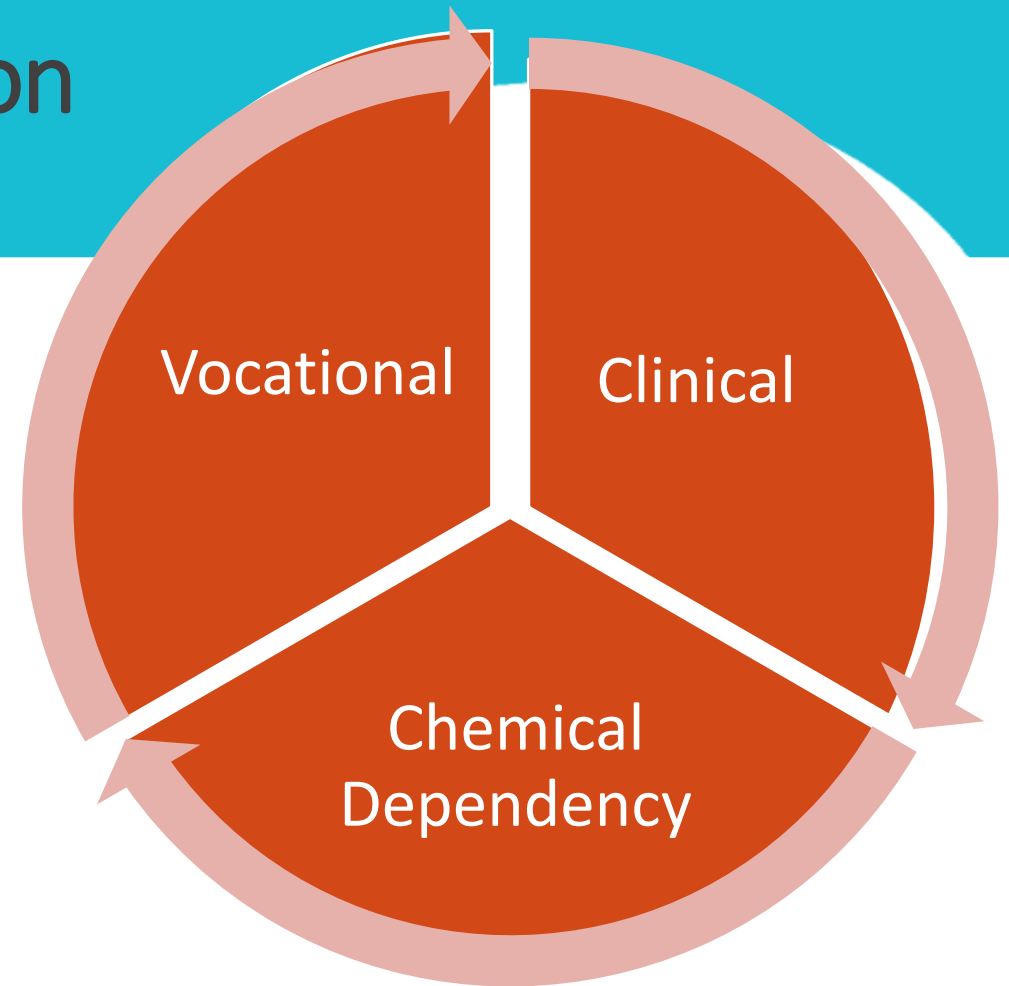

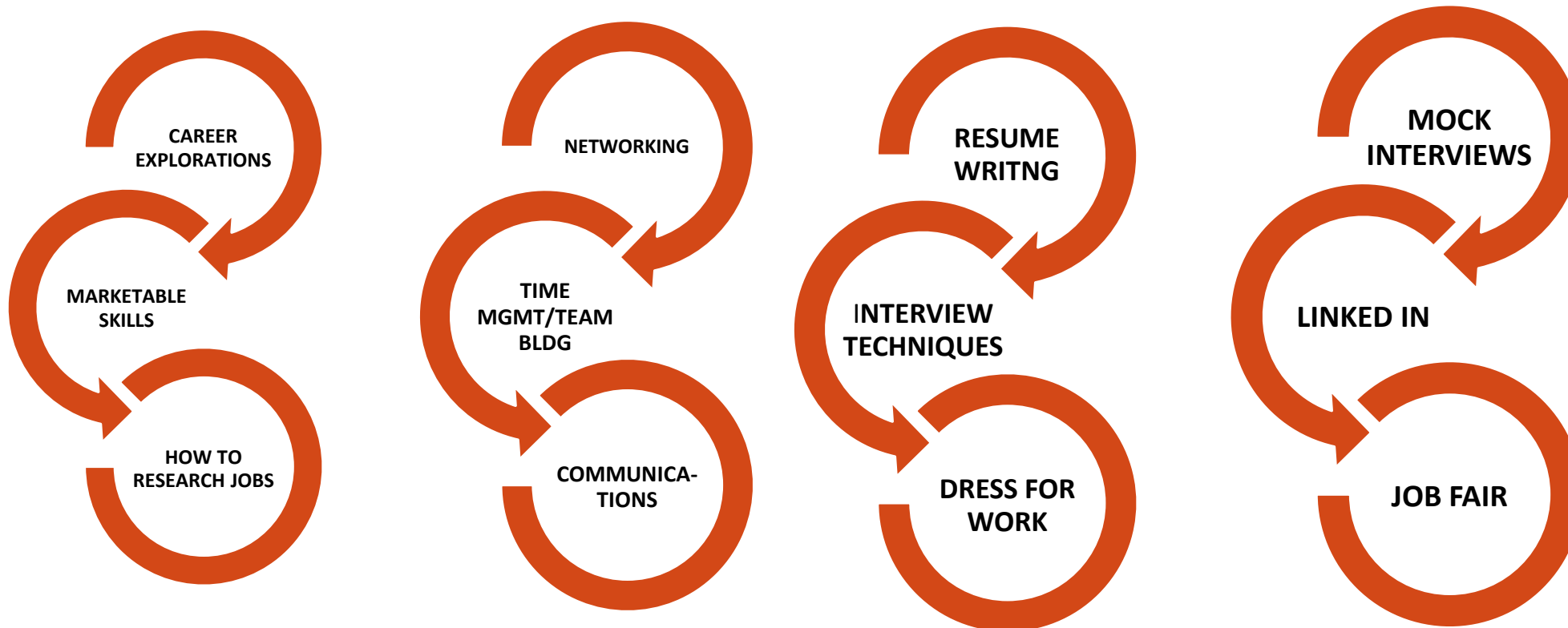


The Womens Home –From Addiction to Self-Sufficiency
