What's Zonta Got To Do With It?

Why is climate changing?

Carbon dioxide traps heat, like a puffy coat



Humans have increased the amount of CO₂ in our atmosphere by 50% since 1750.

We've made Earth's insulating "puffy coat" thicker than it's been in millions of years.
As a result, our climate is warming rapidly.

Not just CO₂:

One pound of methane traps 25 times more heat in the atmosphere than one pound of carbon dioxide. But methane lasts there for only about a decade – CO₂ lasts for centuries

Climate Impact Slow Onset Changes


Weather

Acute Onset Change causes...

- Increased Weather Intensity
- Increased Frequency of Intense and Damaging Weather Systems

Acute onset weather:

- Tornadoes
- Floods
- Drought
- Extreme Storms
- Prolonged Heat
- Excessive precipitation
- Extreme cold

Zonta International calls on Members to:

- ➤ Increase their own awareness of climate change and on its gender-related consequences and raise awareness locally.
- ➤ Include gendered climate change advocacy actions in their advocacy plans.
- ➤ Support the inclusion of women at the national and local tables of decision-makers on environmental sustainability.
- Promote girls' education and the inclusion of climate literacy in schools, as well as to promote girls' science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) studies to increase gendered scientific and technical contributions to climate change mitigation.
- Advocate for national policies that consider women's economic opportunities and ensures their full and equal participation in the economy.
